TREASURER DISCUSSION ITEMS

1. Fiscal Office Update:

I attended and participated in new employee orientations on July 28th at the SOESC Wilmington office and August 4th at Region 14/Hopewell Center. I believe we have added valuable employees to our already excellent staff. I also want to add that Rogina Conroy and Lisa Homan do a very nice job providing this service to new employees.

Karla Dunlap, Lisa Homan and I are processing employment paperwork for 16 new hires, 4 of which had their first pay on August 15th with the remaining new hires having their first pay on August 30th. It takes the fiscal office, on average, two or three hours per employee to load all of their information into the payroll system. It also takes the fiscal office 30-60 minutes per employee that has left our employment to turn off their payroll deductions, leave accruals and calculate final pay amounts.

Mary Camp and I just sent out the first invoices of the year for primary services. Region 14/Hopewell and the ESC's services have been combined into one invoice per district. If you recall, we began this practice in FY14 with the goal of reducing the number of invoices, provide consistency in billing, and make it easier for districts to process payments to the ESC.

The fiscal and human resources offices continue to work closely together to make the HR/Fiscal employment paperwork process seamless. The fiscal and human resources offices have met on August 1st and August 6th and will meet again on August 19th to ensure that we keep the lines of communication open for situations surrounding new hires or situations surrounding veteran employees. I will continue to schedule monthly meetings to ensure that the lines of communication remain open.

I have scheduled meetings on August 18th and August 28th with Lisa Barnhouse at Region 14/Hopewell Center. I feel these meetings are necessary since I am responsible for the Region 14/Hopewell Cooperative Service Book and I feel it is imperative that I keep the lines of communication open to ensure that I am aware of changes/additions, etc. that impact the cost of services to participating districts. I will also be meeting with her to discuss the grants supporting the work of the State Support Team. I plan to continue to schedule these meetings on a monthly basis to ensure that I am kept abreast of any new developments pertaining to cooperative services or grants.

2. Program Update:

Later in the year, I will request that the board transfer dollars from the Gifted Fund to the General Fund. Mr. Unversaw began this process in FY14 and he indicated that he planned to terminate the Gifted Fund in FY15 and process all gifted program transactions through the General Fund.
