GREAT OAKS ITCD REPORT

Mr. Lane updated the board on the March 2016 Great Oaks ITCD Board Meeting. The following bullets are highlights from his report:

- College Credit Plus and Dual Enrollment: Great Oaks students have earned 22,287 academic college credits since the program began in 2004.
- Great Oaks Report Card Great Oaks earned all A's on the recently released 2014-2015 District Report Card. Southern Hills CTC received all A's except in one area.
- Great Oaks Summer Camps 9th and 10th graders can try out a career with a summer camp experience from June 6-9, 2016. Students can explore careers ranging from cooking, cosmetology, sports rehab and digital arts to horse training, construction and aviation.

LEGISLATIVE LIAISON REPORT

Mrs. Gausman shared the Ohio School Boards Association publication, *The Link*. The following bullets are highlights from her report:

- State Legislative Conference held on March 16, 2016 at the Renaissance Hotel in Columbus. The conference provided school board members, administrators and treasurers with a great venue to meet with their state legislators and discuss issues impacting public education.
- U.S. House Education subcommittee holds hearing on ESSA implementation and local governance.
- President Obama releases 2017 budget request. Part of his \$4.1 trillion proposal is committed to Title I and IDEA grants to states.
- Kids PAC Established by the OSBA Executive Committee to give board members the opportunity to belong to a PAC (Political Action Committee) whose membership was aware of the problems facing boards of education and whose goals were armed at dealing with those issues. The PAC is used to support a bipartisan selection of political candidates who support public education. For more information go to www.kidspac.org.

2. Fiscal Office Update:

- Tony, Beth and I have begun meeting with member school districts to review SOESC services, including Region 14, for FY2016 and FY2017. We began these meetings on February 29 and Beth and I will end with those districts in Brown County on March 31, 2016; a total of 8 days with 17 member school districts. To date, the meetings have been positively received.
- Megan has working with Mark Smith, Medicaid Schools Program Lead at the Ohio Department of Education to set up a region wide training at Region 14/Hopewell tentatively scheduled for April 20th. The training would provide questions and answers to the pending federal requirement that all school-based services reimbursed by Medicaid must be ordered, referred or prescribed by a physician or licensed practitioner of the healing arts. This change is effective August 1, 2016.
- Amanda has been helping Lynchburg-Clay transition to a new payroll person. She has been providing this assistance since February and feedback from Lynchburg-Clay Superintendent and Treasurer has been very positive.

3. Professional Development:

- On March 11, 2016 I will attend a Certified Public Records Training in Athens sponsored by Auditor of State David Yost. Pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 109.43(B), attendance at this training is mandatory by the elected official or by their designee. If you recall, at our January Board Meeting I was appointed as the Board's designee to attend this training.
- On April 12, 2016, I will attend the OESCA Spring Conference in Columbus. This conference will
 provide a series of hands-on keynote, general and breakout sessions that are specifically designed
 with Ohio's ESCs and other regional service providers in mind.
