REGULAR BOARD MEETING

OCTOBER 26, 2021

APPROVAL OF THE MEETING AGENDA (Resolution #4452)

MINUTE APPROVAL (Resolution #4453)

RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT FOR WILMINGTON CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR A ONE (1) PERCENT INCOME TAX (RENEWAL) (#4454)

It was moved by Mrs. Gausman and seconded by Mr. Hill to approve the following resolution of support for a one (1) percent income tax renewal on the school district income of individuals and of estates imposed by **Wilmington City School District** for the purpose of current expenses and general on-going permanent improvements at the November 2, 2021 election.

GREAT OAKS ITCD REPORT

LEGISLATIVE LIAISON REPORT

Mr. Peck referenced a copy of "The Link" publication that was provided in board member packets.

• Financial literacy bill awaits action by DeWine

The Ohio Senate and the Ohio House of Representatives sent Senate Bill (SB) 1 to Gov. **Mike DeWine** after the House Primary and Secondary Education Committee accepted a substitute version of the bill and an amendment that includes local flexibility to address the substitute teacher shortage issue.

- The substitute version of the bill moves the one-half unit of instruction that would have been required as part of a student's instruction in social studies to be taken either as an elective course or in lieu of one-half unit of a mathematics course. SB 229 would provide options to schools by extending the deadline for a district to submit a blended learning declaration to April 30, 2022; allowing a school to offer remote learning to a student whose parent requests remote learning; and allowing a school that operates an online learning school to allow a quarantined student in a traditional district school to participate in that online learning school during the period of quarantine. Schools that offer a blended learning model or remote option must ensure that the student has a computer and internet.
- Additionally, SB 229 would prohibit the use of the chronic absenteeism measure on the state report card for the 2021-22 school year, waive the requirement for the 2021-22 school year that a student be automatically withdrawn from an e-school if that student fails to take a state end-of-course exam, and require ODE to calculate an adjusted four-year graduation rate for those students who were continuously enrolled in the same district or building in grades nine-12.

• Recently introduced legislation

- SB 233 was introduced by Blessing, to require the State Board of Education to adopt licensure rules for school nurses and school nurse wellness coordinators and require membership in the state retirement system.
- SB 248 introduced by Antani, requiring school districts to provide a moment of silence each school day rather than permit.
- SB 251 introduced by Sens. **Tim Schaffer** (R-Lancaster) and **Tina Maharath** (D-Columbus), to allow a person under 16 years of age to be employed between 7:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. during the school year if the person has parental or legal guardian consent.
- Mr. Peck also mentioned that OSBA decided to disassociate from NSBA.

BOARD COMMUNICATION PLAN

Mrs. Charters shared the Board Member Interest/External Communication document she created with the members.

She told Mrs. Charters that she had recently emailed her an invitation to attend the next meeting on November 3rd.
