GREAT OAKS ITCD REPORT

Mr. Lane updated the board on the July 2016 Great Oaks ITCD Board Meeting. The following bullets are highlights from his report:

 Enrollment: Enrollment at Great Oaks continues to increase, both on campuses and in satellite programs. This year, 2,664 high school students are enrolled in campus programs, with an anticipated 9,742 in satellite courses.

GREAT OAKS ITCD REPORT (Cont.)

- Special Education Services Redesign: The Special Education Division has been working with the Ohio Department of Education on a three-year plan to better serve students with special needs.
- New Programs and Changing in Delivery Systems: Great Oaks will be offering new or expanded programs in 2016-17. New options include Web Design and Gaming, College Agriculture and another Heavy Equipment Program.

To give students the opportunity to earn more credentials and move along a career pathway at their own pace, Great Oaks will begin offering a sequence of courses leading to career majors. Students will have more flexibility in selecting classes depending on the student's proficiency or career aspirations.

President/CEO Report: Harry Snyder reported that twenty-seven new associates spent a
week in professional development that culminated in an interactive learning simulation at
Miami University.

Eighty-six instructors now comprise the satellite staff. They teach sixteen different programs in 26 locations with growth expected to continue in middle school classes.

American Fidelity is changing their approach to deliver Affordable Care Act (ACA) Compliance services in 2016. This approach includes the creation of a service center in-house at American Fidelity that will take the place of the interaction that many had directly with WorxTime staff last year. Trained consultants on the software (AF Comply) and data analysts will comprise this service center such that every employer can get answers and assistance in their data uploads, corrections of any data issues, and use of the tool through this single service center approach. 
