#### REVISION AND/OR APPROVAL OF THE MEETING AGENDA (Resolution #3878)

# RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT FOR CLINTON-MASSIE LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR AN ADDITIONAL 0.25% EARNED INCOME TAX FOR 5 YEARS (Resolution #3880)

#### LEGISLATIVE LIAISON REPORT

Mrs. Gausman disseminated "The Link" to the board members for their review and reported the following:

- HB 512 Consolidation of state education agencies this legislation would consolidate the Ohio Department of Education (ODE), the Ohio Department of Higher Education and the Governor's Office of Workforce Transformation into a new state agency called the Ohio Department of Learning and Achievement. The bill also would transfer much of the duties and authority of the State Board of Education and Superintendent of Public Instruction to the new agency. House Speaker Cliff Rosenberger (R-Clarksville) stated that this bill would be the House's "mission" for the rest of the year. OSBA has serious concerns about this proposal and will be issuing guidance soon.
- Talking points for opposition to HB 512: Moving to a model where the unique needs of students in grades kindergarten through 12 are lost within an expanded bureaucracy is troubling.

Mrs. Gausman stated that in her opinion there are "too many moving parts to HB512" and that she will reach out to someone for more information and report her findings at the next board meeting.

A representative from the Auditor's office will also be here to provide an update on policy changes. In the afternoon, MVECA will host USAS (accounts payable) and USPS (payroll) roundtables. Our very own Megan Thompson will present at the USAS roundtable on inventory and ACH processes.

- 4. Wilmington College Immersion Program-Mrs. Justice shared that the WC Immersion Program will be ending at the end of this school year as the grant funding has come to an end.
- 5. Hopewell Renovations-Mrs. Justice referred to the upcoming renovations and ask the board to consider meeting at Hopewell in April so they can see the sound panels that have been placed in the large conference room. The Board agreed.
- 6. Alternative School Closure-Mrs. Justice shared that grant funding ended last year and the ESC and districts agreed for the program to continue through the 2018 school year. This continuation cost the ESC \$40,000. The districts are not willing to provide more resources to continue the program and it is not fiscally prudent for the ESC to cover the cost.
- 7. Mrs. Justice shared that the next ESC/OSBA Leadership Academy workshop is April 12. The topic is Communications and Teamwork.
- 8. Mrs. Justice shared that the Exceptional Achievement Award Banquet will take place on April 19, at Hillsboro Elementary.
