#### REGULAR BOARD MEETING

November 28, 2017

The Southern Ohio Educational Service Center Governing Board met on Tuesday, November 28, 2017 at 6:30 p.m. at Region 14 Hopewell Center for its regular monthly meeting. Members present were Mrs. Gausman, Mr. Hill, Mr. Lane, Mr. Luck, Mr. Mount, Mr. Peck, Mr. West and Mr. Wilt, along with Rachel Meyer, Treasurer and Beth Justice, Superintendent. Guests in attendance included Ellen Ryan, Physical Therapist/Team Leader, Region 14/Southern Ohio ESC; Shannon Tise, Occupational Therapist/Team Leader, Region 14/Southern Ohio ESC; Jeff Royalty, Director, Region 14/Southern Ohio ESC.

### APPROVAL OF THE MEETING AGENDA (Resolution #3827)

It was moved by Mr. Peck and seconded by Mr. Mount to approve the agenda as revised.

The board members present unanimously approved the motion. President of the board, Mr. West, declared the motion carried.

### MINUTE APPROVAL (Resolution #3828)

It was moved by Mr. Hill and seconded by Mr. Lane that the October 24, 2017 meeting minutes be approved as presented.

Seven board members approved the motion with an abstention from Mr. Luck. President of the board, Mr. West, declared the motion carried.

Meeting was opened for public participation. None received.

### SOUTHERN OHIO ESC SHARED EXPERTISE

Mrs. Justice thanked Mr. Royalty for hosting the Board Meeting at Region 14/Hopewell Center this evening. She then introduced Mrs. Ryan and Mrs. Tise.

Ellen Ryan, Physical Therapist and Shannon Tise, Occupational Therapist described the makeup of the Motor Team. Mrs. Ryan presented information on what a typical day looks like for a therapist. Mrs. Ryan also described what a Physical Therapist does for our member districts (evaluations, consultations, direct treatment, set up motor labs/hoya lifts, etc.). Mrs. Ryan then described the equipment that motor team has available for loan to our member districts.

Mrs. Tise explained that Occupational Therapists help children to function in life by promoting positive behavior, self-help skills, pre-vocational training, self-regulation, etc. She further explained that Occupational Therapists provide parent and staff education, classroom interventions, fine motor support workshops, etc.

Lastly, Mrs. Ryan and Mrs. Tise explained that Occupational Therapy and Physical Therapy services are provided to our member districts through the IEP process or a 504 plan.

#### **GREAT OAKS ITCD REPORT**

Mr. Lane disseminated the highlights of the November 8, 2017 Board of Directors' Meeting to board members for their review and reported the following:

- Fallon Research Report Paul Fallon of Fallon Research and Communications conducted a survey of over 400 homes in the Great Oaks districts to better understand how they are viewed, perceived value and support among constituents. He reported the following findings to the Great Oaks Board:
  - o 56% said workforce preparation is the more practical role for school
  - o 92% agreed that with increasing college costs, it is essential to provide high school students with advance technical and skills training
  - o 88% are aware of Great Oaks and 77% had a favorable opinion; in 2007, 87% were aware and 65% had a favorable opinion
  - Great Oaks is well known and liked, and it is often seen as an alternative to college, not a pathway
- Job Placement Great Oaks currently has 66 students on job placement. For a senior to be on job placement they must have 95% attendance, 3.0 GPA in their Great Oaks courses and the recommendation from their Career Technical Instructor, and be on track to graduate.

#### LEGISLATIVE LIAISON REPORT

Mrs. Gausman disseminated "The Link" to board members for their review and reported the following:

- Fiscal Year 2018 Federal Budget Resolution and Tax Reform Update The National School Boards Association (NSBA) recently shared an update on the Fiscal Year 2018 federal budget resolution and tax resolution. The following is a condensed version of the information they released.
  - O At the end of October, Congress finalized the FY18 budget resolution, H Con Res 71, which paves the way for tax reform to officially begin. The budget resolution includes broad goals for education on ensuring state flexibility; enhancing outcomes with federal workforce development, job training and reemployment programs; the consolidation and streamlining of overlapping early learning and child care programs; educational programs for individuals with disabilities; and child nutrition programs.

### LEGISLATIVE LIAISON REPORT (Cont.)

- O The budget resolution also includes provisions to address investment in rural schools and in school districts/communities affected by the recent natural disasters. Section 301 pertains to healthcare reform and "protecting the Medicaid program...which may include strengthening and improving Medicaid for the most vulnerable populations," as this impacts school-based Medicaid services.
- O The budget resolution includes an amendment adopted in favor of discontinuing state and local tax deductions (SALT) currently claimed by more than 44 million taxpayers on federal tax returns. If SALT were eliminated in tax reform legislation, the local impact would result in taxpayers being taxed twice and would create instability in state and local tax bases that support investments in public education and other public services. NSBA joined a coalition to continue the SALT deduction called Americans Against Double Taxation.
- HB 369 prescribes a per pupil funding guarantee for certain school districts and to make an appropriation.
- o HB 371 exempts from property taxation the increased value of land subdivided for residential development while construction commences or the land is sold.
- HB 377 with respect to age-appropriate student instruction in child sexual abuse and sexual violence prevention and in-service staff training in child sexual abuse prevention.
- Winter School Finance Workshop set for December 1 Get answers and information on school funding and other education related issues; cost is \$160 which includes materials, lunch and refreshments. - Kids PAC Kids PAC is your political action committee (PAC). PACs are accounts from which political campaign contributions can be made and is a way to focus attention on OSBA's legislative agenda and to support lawmakers who believe in our goals. Giving to Kids PAC helps you get more out of your own political contributions. It "pools" smaller, individual donations into a more sizable contribution that often garners more attention from the political candidate. Contributions can be made by personal check or cash up to \$100. By law, school district and corporate checks cannot be accepted.
