#### <u>LEGISLATIVE LIAISON REPORT</u> (Cont.)

The school district and building report cards released the week of September 10, 2018 – Ohio's public school districts and buildings received an overall letter grade on their state report cards. This summative rating was based on six weighted components and is derived almost exclusively from state test scores.

Superintendent of Public Instruction Paolo DeMaria last year said, "Report cards are just one element of what is happening in a district or school. To get a fuller picture, we encourage people to visit schools and talk to teachers, administrators, parents, and students. A lot of great things are happening every day."

Please review House Bill (HB) 591 which revised the state report card rating system. The bill is currently pending in the House Education and Career Readiness Committee and could receive a vote during the lame-duck legislative session in November or December.

Mrs. Justice disseminated a summary of report cards results to Board members for their review and discussion.
